AL SUMMER LÖNG

Read to succeed with the Des Moines Public Library's Summer Reading program!

Keep reading and learning ALL SUMMER LONG!

It's one of the Des Moines Public Library's favorite times of the year! **All Summer Long**, the library's annual summer reading program, kicks off Monday, June 6. The program is open to anyone age 18 and younger, and is meant to help students retain reading and literacy skills throughout the summer, allowing them to start the next school year on the right foot.

"During the school year, kids have lots of access to books and reading materials, but when school ends, that access disappears," says Maddie Bassman, DMPL's Community Engagement Librarian who visits with hundreds of school-aged kids each week with the library's Rotary Rosie Reader outreach van.

By promoting reading in the summer, Bassman says, the library gives kids the opportunity to retain those skills and academic gains.

Taking part in All Summer Long is free, and kids get an activity log sheet and a new book to keep just for signing up. Read for 20 minutes or complete one of the summer reading activities chosen by our librarians, and you can fill in one of the spaces on the sheet. Fill in all the spaces, and you'll become eligible for a big prize at the end of summer.

The summer reading program is more than just books. Our libraries are filled with fun, interesting programs, like STEM experiments, fun crafts, and performances by fun entertainers.

Programs are also about providing free opportunities for kids. "We bring in guests like the Blank Park Zoo or the Science Center of Iowa, and kids who can't take big trips or visit museums over the summer can see great things at the library," Bassman says. "Whether it's learning about opossums or building with LEGOs, the library can support summer learning in ways that speak to kids' and teens' interests and passions."



Thank you to all those who contributed to the Library Foundation for National Library Giving Day in April. The essay winner, selected by random drawing of all entries, was 9-year old Maddie, who wrote: "The library helped me find my passion for art. I love the library so much, it has all the books I like."

Another library fan wrote: "When I retired almost eight years ago I decided I would make room in my life for reading. Since July 1, 2014, I have not purchased one book, but I have read 296 books. All of those books are from the Des Moines Public Library. This is why I choose to donate to the Des Moines Public Library — because it has saved me money. I figure that the library has saved me a minimum of \$6,000 and those are only for the books I have read from start to finish. It doesn't include the cookbooks, the do-it-yourself manuals, the magazines, CDs, and other materials I've checked out."

She started visiting the Forest Avenue Library when she was young and used the computers and printers to help her in school.

Jordan, a Roosevelt High School graduate, plans

to attend DMACC, then the University of Iowa to study engineering. He wrote, "The library is what sparked my interest in reading and writing." Jordan also stated, "My father sadly passed away when I was younger, so it's just me and my mother. She wants me to go to college, and I just want to make her proud."

Law, a graduate of Hoover High School, plans to attend the University of Advancing Technology in Tempe, Arizona and major in computer science. She utilized the Forest Library for checking out books, as a place to read, and for accessing the free public computers to do research and print papers. To pay for college, she is enlisting in the military as a reserve.
