You can use Kanopy to watch some of the best movies being made, including several A24 films. And by utilizing Libby, you'll have access to more than 11,000 audiobooks. By just using these services instead of comparable subscriptions, you can save \$45/month, or more than \$540/year. *Some residency restrictions apply.* 

**STUDY MORE!** Get the help you and your family need with essay assignments and test preparation. Utilize our free research databases like Brainfuse, Credo, and Mometrix to make sure you have the right information and right preparation.

**READ MORE!** Of course we can help with this one! Find motivation to read all the books on your TBR list and take part in the 2024 Reading Challenge! With 18 categories, plus monthly bonus categories, it's a great opportunity to make time in your day to find time to read. It launches January 1. 






# JAMES PATTERSON ANNOUNCED AS 2024 AVID HEADLINER

LEGENDARY AUTHOR WILL MAKE A STOP AT
SCOTTISH RITE CONSISTORY FOR A FREE AUTHOR TALK



James Patterson, one of the best-selling authors in the world, will headline the Des Moines Public Library's 2024 Authors Visiting in Des Moines (AViD) series. The program will take place at Scottish Rite Consistory, at 519 Park Street in downtown Des Moines, on Wednesday, April 10.

Patterson will discuss his career and his upcoming nonfiction book, *The Secret Lives of Booksellers and Librarians: True Stories of the Magic of Reading* (release date: April 8, 2024). The book tells the real-life stories of people in two professions that Patterson himself calls "superheroes."

One of the most popular storytellers of our time, Patterson has sold hundreds of millions of books worldwide during his illustrious, prolific career. He is the creator of popular characters and series like Alex Cross, the Women's Murder Club, Jane Effing Smith, and Maximum Ride, and

of true stories about the Kennedys, John Lennon, Princess Diana, as well as military heroes, police officers, and ER nurses. He has coauthored best-selling novels with Bill Clinton and Dolly Parton, told the story of his own life in *James Patterson by James Patterson*, and has received an Edgar Award, nine Emmy Awards, the Literarian Award from the National Book Foundation, and the National Humanities Medal.

Admission for AVID is free, and seating is first-come, first-served. Patterson will sign books following the program. More details about the event, including information on a special VIP meet-and-greet, will be announced in the coming weeks.

The remainder of the 2024 Authors Visiting in Des Moines (AViD) lineup will be revealed in early 2024.



Attendees at this year's Iowa Author Awards dinner celebrated four accomplished local writers and heard from Pulitzer Prize winning author **Andrew Sean Greer** in an evening that raised funds for the Des Moines Public Library Foundation.

Focused on the theme that "Libraries are for Everyone," this year's program continued our new tradition of reciting the Library Bill of Rights before the meal. Led by former board member Judy McCoy Davis, the recitation is a reminder of Des Moines' leading role in protecting the Freedom to Read.

Keynote Andrew Sean Greer shared a personal story about a formative library experience. His parents took him to his local library, telling him "Nothing in here can hurt you." Greer flipped rhetoric about books promoting "dangerous ideas" into a hilarious talk that highlighted our library system's vibrant programming. Our October calendar provided Greer with ample material: The descriptions of escape rooms, insect zoos, and other Halloween-themed activities that he read aloud had the crowd howling.

Greer, a Pulitzer Prizewinning author of several books, including Less and Less is Lost, was also

interviewed by *DSM* editor **Michael Morain**, who spotlighted how rare it is for humorous literature to be taken seriously. For Greer, it wasn't until he started embracing his own identity and experiences as a gay man that he found his true voice as a writer.

That sentiment rang true for our honorees, whose acceptance speeches called attention to the need for stories that celebrate queer and autistic youth, narratives that center children of color, and *happily ever afters* for bold women. Accepting our 2023 Iowa Author Awards were:



**EMERGING IOWA AUTHOR: Amy Lillard**, whose book *Exile in Guyville* won the BOA Editions Short Fiction Prize.

**FICTION AWARD: Tracey Garvis Graves**, international bestselling author of contemporary fiction, including *Heard It in a Love Song*.

**CHILDREN'S LITERATURE: Abena Imhotep**, author of the children's book *Omari's Big Tree and the Mighty Djembe*.

**SPECIAL INTEREST AWARD: Denise Williams**, author of nine books, including *Even if the Sky is Falling* and *Technically Yours*.

The 2023 Iowa Author Awards marked the Foundation's 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Co-chaired by **Pamela Bass-Bookey** and **Harry Bookey**, longtime library supporters **Steve Jayne** and **Karen Shaff** were also honored as the 2023 Friends of Literacy. With so much to celebrate, the evening was successful in raising over \$102,000 to benefit the library system.


